1. Visit tfsbillpay.com and click the orange button labeled “SIGN UP today.”

4. Confirm your personal information. This data is pulled directly from court records, so it should be accurate.

2. Enter your name and email address to start setting up your account on TFS. You will receive a verification email that will let you log in.

5. Enter your account information, payment amounts, and your payment dates.

Note: In order to ensure plan payments arrive at your trustee's office on time, you need to sign up for TFS two weeks prior to your payment date. TFS drafts subsequent monthly payments approximately 5 business days before your payment date, so please plan accordingly.

3. Once you log in, click “Enroll in Trustee Pay” and enter your case number. You can find this information on the official paperwork sent to you by your Chapter 13 trustee.
